The National Energy Commission (CNE) released a new contractual model governing how power plants, energy storage systems and large consumers connect to Mexico's

Mexico's National Power System (Sistema Eléctrico Nacional or SEN) is one of the largest in the world and it provides electrical supply to more than 129 million inhabitants.

Unlike other energy commodities such as coal, oil and natural gas, electricity trade between countries is relatively limited as it is more technically complex and requires a direct cross-border interconnection.

After Tuesday's extraordinary session, the CFE Board of Directors also announced it is taking steps to strengthen the electrical grid in the Yucatán Peninsula ahead of the summer

CFE plans 275 new transmission lines and 524 substations to modernize Mexico's grid, boost reliability, and reach over 50 million users.
